RILM ANNUAL REPORT

During the past year (June 1, 2004-May 31, 2005), 286 submissions were sent to the RILM Centre in New York. That figure may be broken down as follows: 144 dissertations, 42 monographs, 14 monograph citations, 73 articles, and 13 reviews. This represents a decrease from the 299 submissions that were sent in 2003-04. RILM now permits access to its IBIS database for submissions by our committee members. This has improved the workflow and 2005-06 will see a marked increase in our submission rate. The forms at www.rilm.org will continue to be available for volunteer and author submissions.

I would like to thank Brian McMillan, Kathleen McMorrow, Robin Elliott and committee member Hélène Boucher for their continued efforts to abstract scholarly Canadian music materials for RILM. Thanks also to Carleton University music students, Anthony Erb (2004 summer semester), Krista Fielding (2004 fall-2005 winter semesters) and David Promane (2005 winter semester) for their volunteer work.
